Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Delaware Valley School District was notified of 12 new cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) from April 1 – April 6 as follows: Dingman-Delaware Primary School – 1, Dingman-Delaware Elementary School – 2, Delaware Valley Elementary School – 1, Delaware Valley Middle School – 2 and the Delaware Valley High School - 6. The classrooms and spaces used by the individuals have been cleaned and disinfected according to CDC guidelines. All close contacts have been notified.

Since the Dingman-Delaware Elementary School has reached their threshold today, they will be 100% remote for Wednesday, April 7 and Thursday, April 8. This means all DDES students will stay home and learn remotely using their Chromebooks and Schoology. The students can physical return to the school on Friday, April 9.

The Delaware Valley High School reached their threshold over spring break, and they are currently on 100% remote from Tuesday, April 6 – Friday, April 9. This means all DVHS students will stay home and learn remotely using their Chromebooks and Schoology. The students can physically return to the school on Monday, April 12.

Parents/Guardians, students, and staff are encouraged to do the following to help prevent the spread of illness at home and in school:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and/or have tested positive
- Wash your hands frequently
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Stay home when you are sick or come in close contact with someone who has tested positive
- Cover your mouth and nose with the inside of your elbow when you cough and sneeze
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces
- Practice social distancing and wear a mask

Please keep your child home if they are experiencing any of the following signs or symptoms: fever (100.4 F or greater), cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, lack of smell or taste, sore throat, chills, muscle pain, headache, congestion, or runny nose.

The Delaware Valley School District will continue to monitor the situation and will provide updates as needed. Please know the health and safety of our students and staff is our utmost priority.
