
Christopher Columbus was an early explorer, who discovered and explored the Americas, however there were Native Americans living in the Americas.

Columbus was born in Italy in 1451. He later lived in Lisbon. He worked as a trader there. Columbus thought he could get to China and Southeast Asia, or the East Indies by sailing through the Atlantic Ocean. He was proved wrong. Planet: Uranus



The many moons of Uranus- In the year 1986, the Voyager 2 Spacecraft traveled the deepest space mission yet! It's was about to give NASA scientists the first ever close-up of Uranus! The spacecraft will uncover 10 new moons! A few are just a couple hundred miles away. Someday the moons might collide into each other. They are one of Uranus's many mysteries!

What is Uranus - Uranus is over 31,000 miles (50,000 kilometers) wide. Like

Neptune, it's known as an ice giant. Half of Uranus is made up of swirling fluids and gasses. The temperatures there can drop as low as -371 degrees Fahrenheit, (-224 degrees Celsius) The ice giant gives off less heat than it could take in.

Fun fact- A stinky planet- Some of Uranus's atmosphere is made up of a gas called Hydrogen sulfide, The gas smells like rotten eggs!

There are 13 narrow rings going around the planet that can be quite hard to spot! The outer rings are brightly colored, the inner rings are dark and dusty. Uranus gets the bright color from all its methane gas in its atmosphere. It has no true surface. Its core is rocky and small.

How did Uranus form? - The solar system formed 4.6billion years ago! Gravity pulled gas and a lot of space dust together to form the planets! Uranus orbits the sun on its side with one pole always facing away from the sun.

I think that seals are very cool, seals help maintain a balance in the food web. Seals consume fish and squid. Seals are also important food source for larger predators, like polar bears and sharks.

Seals are well adapted to cold polar environments like Antarctica, Alaska, and some in Iceland. Most seals also have a layer of fur, giving additional insulation on land, their blubber keeps them warm in extremely cold temperatures. They have at least two layers of fluff, and an outer layer of fluff with dark furs, and an inner, downlike layer of underfur, referred to as "Guard furs." The outer furs keep the inner layer warm and dry; they have a structure that helps them stick together, seal in air and heat.


If you are in DVE-TV, you will also go on interesting day trips to interview exciting people and see cool places.


