

T-Shirt Bracelets

<u>Supplies</u>: For this craft you will need old t-shirts, bangle bracelets (old or new), and scissors.



<u>Step 1</u>: Cut t-shirt in 1/2" to 1" wide strips. Depending on the thickness of the bangle – a thick bracelet will need thicker strips.



Step 2: Loosely tie one end of the tshirt strip to the bangle and start wrapping fabric around bracelet – the tighter the better.

<u>Step 3</u>: Wrap fabric all the way around until you meet the first knot – untie the knot and tie both ends together to close. Make a double

knot, pull it tight and make sure the knot is positioned on the inside of the bracelet. Trim ends with scissors.

who was to instruct me did the complete opposite. He was my seventh grade science teacher and he preyed on me. No, I

wasn't sexually or physically abused by him, but I was verbally and mentally abused. I was ridiculed by him during class. In his science class my name was "Dumb, Dumb Debbie". That was it and it was even written in his gradebook. He called me that every day and chuckled. He told me I was stupid, dumb, and would never amount to anything in life. When I took a test or quiz, he would joyfully search through all the papers, find mine, and then wave it up in the air. He'd announce to the class. "Let's see how Dumb, Dumb, Debbie did!" he then would read off each wrong response and after each one he'd get right in my face and exclaim, "You're so STUPID!" That was the

experience that made me decide to become a teacher. I became a teacher so that no one would have to go through what I did. No one should have to go through that.

Q: How many exciting experiences have you had?

A: I've had many exciting experiences. I love to travel and I'd love to see the world. You may think I've been to many places, but I really haven't. My family has traveled around the world for their careers, but I travel in my imagination. I love learning about other cultures and I hope to see some first hand. September 22, 1946 would start one of the most successful baseball careers of all time. Yogi Berra would win

American League's Most Valuable Player Award three times. He was on 10 World Series teams. Also, he's was selected for the All- Star team 18 times. But before all that happened he was a Seaman in the Navy, and then he went to the Minor league Cardinals. After a few years he was signed with the Yankees. After 1963, Yogi Berra became the manager to the New York Yankees. At the end of that season he was fired. But he wasn't fired for long--he was signed as a coach for the New York Mets. He stayed there for five years until his firing on August 5, 1975. In 1976 he was rehired by the Yankees again. There he remained until the 16th

game in the 1985 season. After that season he went to the Houston Astros. In 1999 he retired fully. He lived in a quiet New Jersey town until his death in September 22, 2015.

Olive. Olive thought of herself as the kid that was just, OK. Her initials even said so.


The other kids made fun of her name and said the she had some kind of deathly disease so people would keep away. To make everything even worse, Olive was mentally, physically, and cyberbullied!
