## 6th Grade Sketchbook

This assignment is for the entire marking period. You will have one day a week, Friday, to work on the assignments in class. <u>Cover: Front and back.</u> Elements of Art. Divide the cover (front and back) into 7 sections, one for each element of art. Use your Elements of Art handout and any other resources you may have to illustrate each of the elements of art.
