

But is it in a good way? Recently this summer, PopCap released Plants vs. Zombies 2 exclusively for iOS devices. Already, I see a problem there... Why release the game for one specific device instead of the systems that the first game is on, like the iPhone, Android, PC, MAC, heck! It's even on the PlayStation 3 and Xbox 360. The story is when Crazy Dave eats the most amazing taco in the world, he wants to eat it again, so he uses his time traveling RV, Penny, to go back in time five minutes earlier. But then a malfunction happens and they
