

The 2014-2015 DVMS Spelling Bee was held in the DVMS Library at 9 A.M. Out of the 600 students who took the written test, only 30 of them moved on to the school spelling bee, and I was one of them. Mrs. Masker was the pronouncer (the person who gives us our word to spell). There were 3 judges. Parents were invited to come see their children spell. Before the actual bee started, there was a prac-

tice round so the participants and the parents would understand how the bee works. I was the 22th person to spell, and my practice word was ''diabolical''.
