Pot O'Green Planter

Hey everyone! Since St. Patrick's Day is coming up, I thought a craft would help you get into the St. Patty's spirit! It's a Leprechaun Hat Pot! If you're planning on planting then use this! Good luck! Materials:

- 3-inch green plastic planters (These can be found at a dollar store)
- 1 small potted plant (from your local florist)
- Black ribbon
- Bamboo skewer, craft stick or a coffee stirrer
- 1 piece craft foam in yellow and green •
- 1 sheet white paper or card stock
- Markers/crayons/colored pencils .
- Scissors
- Craft glue

Step 1: Choose a small plant, like shamrocks, marigolds, or primroses.

Step 2: Make the belt buckle by cutting a 1inch piece of craft foam. Fold the square in half, and snip two cuts across the fold, but not all the way to the edge of the square. Step 3: Unfold the square and thread a piece of ribbon through two slits. Step 4: Glue the buckled ribbon around the planter like a belt.

Step 5: Make the rainbow pick by drawing a cloud with four curved lines coming out of it on your white paper.

Step 6: Color your rainbow pick! It can be ROYGBIV or any other order you'd like! Step 7: Cut rainbow out, and glue to a green piece of craft foam. Trim bamboo skewer to about 5 inches and tape to the back of the rainhow

Step 8: Put your plant and pick in your pot. Now you have an amazing pot for St. Patty's Day!
